On that note, the weather will continue to become chillier, so please make sure your child has seasonally appropriate clothing in their cubby, as well as, a sweater or sweatshirt for chilly mornings on the playground.

The first two weeks of October we will talk all about the Fall. We will * observe and describe the seasonal changes in plants, animals, and their personal lives. We are hoping to spend a lot of time outside, taking nature walks and do some leaf collecting. Our art activities will include watercolor leaves, leaf rubbing, nature walk collages and so much more. We will also be working on identifying leaves and the trees they come from.

The following week will be all about Pumpkins and gourds. We have so many great activities planned for this week! The children will be making a variety of pumpkin inspired artwork and decorating their own pumpkin too. <u>Please bring in a</u> <u>small pumpkin By October 13th</u>. During circle we will be asking open ended questions as the children make observations about the pumpkin shells and insides as we begin to carve them, this will give them the chance to *make predictions about changes in objects or materials based on past experiences.

The last two weeks of October will be dedicated to Make Believe & Halloween. This time of year can get a bit confusing for children, especially with all of the costumes and decorations. We try to alleviate some of this confusion by discussing real vs. pretend, monsters, masks and imagination. The children will be able to *ask & seek out answers with the assistance of interested adults. Some of artwork will be pure fantasy with princesses and castles, some will be spooky with ghosts, witches, and monsters. We will be working on Halloween t- shirts and a lot more fun is in store.
